Small Groups

What are Small Groups for Men?

Small Groups for Men are comprised of men from the parish who gather to discuss their lives in the light of their Catholic faith and to share their faith and experiences through friendship, prayer, and fraternity. While there is no standard group size, current groups range from two to ten members.

What happens at a Small Group Meeting?

Men generally meet to pray, socialize, and discuss their faith. They support, affirm and share insights about the difficulties men encounter in both their home and work lives. The also seek God's help in dealing with the issues they confront every day. Members strive to reinforce Christian values in their home, reach out to share those values with others in their group, and support other men who are struggling to do the same. There are various formats to group sessions depending on the members. Discussions can focus on readings, such as bible passages, the catechism, or religious books; issues facing members; seasonal themes such as lent or Easter: etc.

What will I gain from attending a Small Group Meeting?

Men have found that by attending they make friends among their fellow parishioners, have fun, and learn from one another on how to be a better husband, father, son, employee and Catholic parishioner. Men say they have grown by this experience which has enabled them to form stronger, happier families and marriages and have helped them to learn how to better cope with the inevitable stresses inherent in the workplace.
