

In 1859, the Blessed Mother appeared to Adele Brise, a young Belgian immigrant, and instructed her to teach the children in the faith. Father Stryker, a Cincinnati native, served as Rector of the shrine from 2010, when it was dedicated by Bishop David L. Ricken, until 2016.
